

## St George's Church Grosvenor Chapel July–October 2017: issue 37

une seems to be an auspicious month for St George's. On 12<sup>th</sup> June 1711, the Act of Parliament that established the Commission for the Building of Fifty New Churches (in London) received royal assent. St George's was one of twelve churches actually built. 306 years and six days later - on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2017 to be precise - the Parochial Church Council of St George's unanimously adopted an imaginative plan to bring into active use that half of St George's only ever previously used for storage (see page 9). People are often surprised to hear the Undercroft is that large. And yet the floor area of our handsomely vaulted crypt is in fact even greater than that of the church itself at ground level, extending as it does under the portico.

In his introduction to the business plan considered by the PCC on 18th June, the Rector wrote, 'St George's is faced with one of the biggest decisions and opportunities in its near 300 year history, and what a way to mark our forthcoming 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary: to bring the unused space under the Church to life, whilst at the same time offering access to people with disabilities.' He went on to allude to the Parable of the Talents reminding Council members that 'it is simply not Christian to bury our talents and hide the Master's money safely away out of fear and nervousness. We are to use all the resources God gives us, both personally as baptised Christians, and also as the Body of Christ in this parish. We are presented with a huge opportunity to leave things better for those who come after us.

We will outline detailed plans for the operation of the Undercroft once it opens next year in later editions of this Newsletter. In the meantime we have been told work will start on the 40-week conversion on 24<sup>th</sup> July. The church itself will remain open throughout although access to the south gallery will be restricted for a number of months. Alternative toilet arrangements will also be made, details of which will be published in the church, on our website and in the Weekly Bulletin circulated every Friday. If you do not currently receive the Bulletin but would like to, please get in touch. Contact details may be found on the back page of this publication. I also hope to run a pictorial blog illustrating the conversion process as it happens. Details of how to access this will be published electronically in the coming weeks.

Meanwhile the life of St George's will continue although not without some important other changes unrelated to activity beneath our feet.

After more than twenty three years' service as Verger at St George's, Seamus O'Hare has asked to reduce the hours he works. As a result we have advertised for a second parttime verger who will not only cover the hours for which Seamus will no longer be on duty but also some of his out of hours duties, notably at weddings and some of the many concerts and other evening events that take place in the church. A copy of the advertisement appearing in the Church Times and on the London Diocesan website as this Newsletter goes to press may be found on page 6. We hope that the new arrangements will come into play in October. In the meantime,

ncountering a breathtaking creation such as Pisano's Baptistry Pulpit in Pisa (and there are countless other examples) is a reminder to the preacher of the care and preparation required to encounter the mystery of God. Such works of art, as well as being an inspiration, make it quite clear that the Word of God is to be taken seriously and carefully. No quick or shoddy appreciation of beauty is possible. Time is required and demanded in order to engage.

After applying for tickets for the past 25 years I am off to Bayreuth to see my favourite non-Ring Wagner operas in August. I've been once before, and was struck how what was passed off to the music student as Wagner's almost mad megalomania actually begins to make sense when you see how things fit together. The opera house itself is a marvel. And starting at 4pm means in effect most of the day has to be given over to engaging with Wagner's art/music. Changing into suitable clothes...getting there etc. Rather sensibly each interval lasts an hour. Time not only for a drink and a bratwurst, but also 20 minutes to calm down after the inevitably intrusive interventions of the Director, 20 minutes to try and make sense of what he/she might be trying to say, and finally 20 minutes in order to clear the mind and start the next Act as open and receptive as possible. There are no quick-fixes or short cuts!

## The Rector writes . . .

In the case of most of our congregation I can imagine that again, a lot of preparation and time is involved in worshipping at St George's. Perhaps up to an hour to get here (longer in the case of some of our choir), another hour to get home etc. so that coming to the Sung Eucharist and getting home might often take up to 4 hours of somebody's time on a Sunday. Hopefully just the journey here and home can be used as a good time for preparation and reflection. And we all know from decorating our homes, as in so many jobs, how most of the time is taken up in careful and meticulous preparation. Doing the actual painting is the quick bit.

Preparing for worship is no different. Anglicans are encouraged to read the Collect, Epistle, and Gospel, the night before, or perhaps in the morning— to consider what sins we might be sorry for or to think about who or what we wish to pray for.

In the Book of Common Prayer we read: 'what is required of them who come to the Lord's Supper?'

Answer: To examine themselves, whether they repent them truly of their former sins, steadfastly purposing to lead a new life; have a lively faith in God's mercy through Christ, with a thankful remembrance of his death; and be in charity with all men.

In advance of coming to church, or maybe when we arrive we might wish to use the following by way of preparation:

The Beatitudes (St Matthew 5: 3-11)

The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20)

Veni Creator Spiritus (Come Holy Ghost our Souls inspire...)

### The Comfortable Words:

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all who truly turn to him. Come unto me, all ye that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. *Matthew* 9:28

So God loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3: 16

Hear also what Saint Paul saith. This is a true saying, and worthy of all men to be received, That Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. *1 Timothy 1: 15* 

Hear also what Saint John saith. If any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the Propitiation for our sins. *1 John 2: 1-2* 

When I arrived at St George's as Rector I was impressed by the words of preparation which my predecessor Fr John Slater had added at the beginning of the Sung Eucharist leaflets - seasonally variable words of preparation. Also by the words of thanksgiving to be said privately after receiving the Holy Sacrament. In addition of course, every Eucharist begins with the Collect for Purity which itself is a preparation for worship and a call to open our hearts. This Collect, along with the prayer of St Richard of Chichester, is learned by heart by all the children who attend St George's, Hanover Square, School. And so we pray that we may be prepared ... the message of St John the Baptist, and a lifetime's vocation for the Christian who one day will meet God face to face, be called upon to give an account, and, we hope, be ready and willing to receive God's love and mercy.


**The Royal Society of St George** are invited to join us for their Annual Parade Service on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> October



The successful candidate will be a practising Christian sympathetic with the ethos of traditional Anglican worship, to the disparate needs of visitors, wedding couples and the homeless as well as with the practicalities of the many concerts that take place at St George's.

An attractive remunerative package is offered, comprising a competitive salary and accommodation in a two-bedroom flat close to the church. Residence in this flat is required.

It is hoped that the successful candidate will start work in October.



## Churches Together in Westminster Prisons Mission


t George's was one of three founding members of the Churches Together in Westminster Prisons Mission in 2013. Since then several members of our congregation have been actively involved in the leadership and growth of the initiative. The aims are firstly; to support the multi-faith Chaplaincy Teams, which work, often under intense pressure, in some of the overunderstaffed London crowded, prisons; secondly, to enable a small number of volunteers to practice their personal ministry by reaching out to prisoners, some of whom are isolated, vulnerable and have suffered abuse and neglect; thirdly, to take the messages about prisons and prisoners back to our churches, so that we all learn more about the 94,800 men, women and children detained inside them "in our name".

We have recently taken on more volunteers, some of whom aim to regularly attend one of the Visitors' Centres adjacent to the prison gates. There they can be a friendly, non- official face for the often distressed and anxious members of an inmate's family. Others will undergo training before becoming mentors for individuals for several weeks before and after discharge from custody. We now need to recruit some volunteers who are willing and able to provide regular administrative support within the busy Chaplaincy Team offices. They will be at the interface of links between prisoners,

officers, family and chaplains. For those unwilling or unable to take on the pressures of visiting a prison, there are opportunities to become a Prisoners' Penfriend. By this means one can engage in regular correspondence with a prisoner and have all the letters sent to and from prison via a wellmanaged central office, to maintain the confidentiality of the writer's home address. Such communications sometimes continue for many years and are found to be of value and interest to both parties.

The key churches engaged with the Prisons Mission have been Anglican, but we will soon be joined by the Roman Catholic Church of Notre Dame de France in Leicester Square. One of their major achievements is the development of a range of high quality advice and support services for refugees. With their help, we hope to extend our reach to some of the hundreds of people held in Immigration Detention Centres, pending reviews of their cases, or deportation. We hope that a leading Baptist church will soon engage and thus increase the denominational spread of the initiative.

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Prisons has recently referred to the system as being "in crisis". The Prison Governors Association has, for the first time in its history, called for "an independent public inquiry into the state of prisons due to the increase of sui-



cides, self-harm and violence." The government has recently appointed the fifth Justice Secretary in six years. I his first speech on taking office, Justice Secretary David Lidington MP expressed his determination to "make prisons true places of safety, reform and rehabilitation and to support offenders to turn their lives around".


Against this background, the contribution of a few volunteers and the growing interest of a few central London churches is no more than minute. However, it is also illuminating and valued by all concerned, both inside and outside.


